Councilman Petrocy made the motion and Councilman Kupczyk seconded the motion to approve the following resolution authorizing the Town of Elma to join the Erie County Aggregation: WHEREAS, Article 5-G of the General Municipal Law authorizes municipal corporations to enter into cooperative agreements for the performance of those functions or activities in which they could engage individually; and WHEREAS, Section 119-N of the General Municipal Law defines the term "Municipal Corporation" to a mean a county outside the city of New York, a city, a town, a village, a board of cooperative educational services, fire district or a school district; and WHEREAS, it has been determined that the Town of Elma can save money by the joint purchasing of energy; and WHEREAS, the Town of Elma has determined that it may purchase energy through the use of marketing firm, individually or through an energy cooperative; NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that the Town of Elma would like to participate in the Erie County Aggregation by authorizing the Supervisor to execute the attached Electric and Natural Gas Co-Operative Purchasing Agreements for said Aggregation indicating the Town of Elma will agree to be bound thereby.
