Making the legal notice for the Public Hearing on National Fuel/Northern Access Project 2016 part of the minutes Supervisor Powers opened the public hearing at 7:01pm. Speaking against the project Dr. Camody from Bullis Rd, Ms Sobczak from Gaylord Ct, Ms Koch from Bowen Rd, Ms Cannova from Bowen Rd also concerned citizens from Sardinia, Wales, Kenmore, Pendleton, Lackawanna, Bowmansville and Clarence were heard. Councilman Fallon made the motion and Councilman Petrocy seconded the motion to approve the Resolution for the Proposed Yellow Dot Program as follows: WHEREAS, the New York State Sheriff's Association Yellow Dot Program was designed to help first responders provide life-saving medical attention during the "golden hour" after a crash or emergency event; and WHEREAS, a Yellow Dot decal adhered to the driver's- side rear window of a vehicle will alert first responders that vital medical information for the driver and or passenger is stored in the vehicle's glove compartment; and WHEREAS, the Yellow Dot Program can be also be utilized at a residence by placing the decal on an entry door(s) of a dwelling as to alert first responders that important medical information for one or more of the residents, within the dwelling, can be located in a clear plastic bag in the freezer compartment of the refrigerator; and WHEREAS, Erie County Sheriff Timothy B. Howard and the sheriff's office has staff and resources dedicated to raising the awareness of the Yellow Dot program in the towns, villages and communities throughout Erie County; and WHEREAS, the sheriff's office has encountered situations where a Yellow Dot decal has been helpful to first responders at the scene of an incident and contributed to the fast and proper triage of a victim. NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, the Town of Elma does hereby recognize the live-saving potential of the Yellow Dot program; and be it further RESOLVED, that this Honorable Body declares the Town of Elma as a Yellow Dot community and encourages all citizens to sign-up for and participate in the live-saving program Yellow Dot Program.
