Guide to Recycling at the Transfer Station

There has been a little confusion at times and questions as to what is recyclable and what goes in the trash?

Recyclable Items

NEWSPAPERS, MAGAZINES, & CATALOGS

Anything that comes with your regular newspaper. All magazines, catalogs, phone books, junk mail & writing paper

CORRUGATED CARDBOARD

All brown corrugated cardboard. Brown paper bags. Box board (shoe Bbox material)

GLASS BOTTLES

All clear, green & brown food & beverage containers.

METAL CANS

All metal food & beverage containers (cans)

PLASTIC

Plastic food, soap & beverage containers with threaded cap

Items to place in the recycling box

Place in recycling box loose or put next to the bin in paper bags, junk mail & writing paper must be put in paper bags.

Remove all tape, staples & strapping. Break down all boxes in 3ft. x 3ft. sections.

Wash containers. Remove lids & caps. Labels need not be removed. Containers, metal lids & caps go in the recycling box.

Wash containers. Labels do not have to be removed.

Wash containers. No wide mouth containers such as yogurt & cottage cheese even if labeled. No styrofoam, deli or microwave containers.

Items to place in the trash

Bound books, napkins, tissue paper towels, wax paper, wrapping paper or any food stained paper.

Waxed corrugated cardboard, cardboard stained with oil, lined with foam, carpet rolls, laminated sheets, pizza boxes, pop can boxes, tv dinner boxes, food boxes.

Ceramic items. flower pots, crystal, lightbulbs, mirror, window panes, heat resistant ovenware

Silverware, frozen juice, small appliances, metal cookware, foil.
NO BATTERIES.

Anti-freeze or motor oil containers, furniture, plastic bags, tableware, medicine bottles, plexiglass, fast food containers, Tupperware.

What's New with Tri-Town Recreation this Summer

NOTE: If you have children involved with Tri Town Recreation, please review some important changes in this year's program.

Tri -Town Recreation will continue to offer quality programs during the summer of 2011. Seven (7) weeks of programming has been scheduled for youth in kindergarten through 9th grade from **Monday, June 27th - Friday August 12th, 2011. Three (3) 2 week sessions and a 1-week Special Week are planned.**

Our **CAMP PROGRAMS** will be offered to youth who have completed **kindergarten-9th grade**. Tri-Town Recreation Day Camp operates with a permit for children's camps from the NYS Department of Health. Our **Day Camps Programs** will be held at **Marilla Primary School** on Bullis Road just east of Two Rod Road this summer. We thank the Iroquois District for finding us an alternative location while Capital Projects take place on the Iroquois main campus.

****Bus transportation is available if needed.** They are scheduled from the EMW Boys & Girls Club at 7:15am & 8:45am

****Campers may sign up for 10 days in a 2 week session or 6 days in a 2 week session.**

DAY CAMP (9am-3pm): Tri Town Recreation is geared for fun, exploration and adventure! Campers will be placed in a group, according to grade level, to ensure activities are geared toward specific interests and abilities. Two leaders will be with each group to travel to a variety of planned programs throughout the day. Leaders are chosen for their experience and interest in working with youth in a camp setting. Campers will participate in sports & games, cooking, crafts, water activities, nature awareness and our newest program, "Camper Choice" throughout the week. Other programs, guests from the community and specific events will be planned throughout the summer around different weekly themes. Youth will be traveling to local parks, the Marilla Community Center and field trip sites each week.

****Due to the closing of the Iroquois Pool this summer, there will be NO swimming during Day Camp hours. Swim times are ONLY available during the Total Day Camp hours this summer. (More information below)**

TOTAL DAY CAMP (7:15am-5:30pm) This is an extended day camp program, around the day camp program listed above.

Early Rise Program: Starting at 7:15am, campers will have the opportunity to enjoy planned activities while being with friends from camp. Our staff will offer a variety of activities campers may join as they arrive to camp. The gym will be open for planned games. Campers may be dropped off any time between 7:15am-9am.

PM GYM or SWIM: Campers have a choice of 2 options between 3-5:30pm

****Campers may stay at Marilla Primary and participate in planned activities offered in the gym, outside and/or in the cafe. Parents may pick up their campers anytime between 3-5:30pm.**

****This summer, our recreational swim program will be held at Alden High School only during the Total Day Camp hours. We thank the Alden Schools for providing us pool time while Capital Projects take place at Iroquois. An Iroquois bus will transport campers, Tri-Towns Recreation staff and our certified lifeguards daily to Alden to participate in swimming. Campers and staff will leave Marilla Primary at 3:30 pm, swim and arrive back to Marilla Primary by 5:30.**

Tri Towns Recreation will be offering two **TEEN CAMPS** for youth that have completed **6th - 8th grades** during the summer. The **LEADERSHIP IN TRAINING PROGRAM (LIT)** will give youth the opportunity to learn and practice leadership skills while enjoying daily activities, socializing with peers and attending weekly field trips. The **ADVENTURE PROGRAMS** offer theme oriented activities with field trips and daily activities.

The **JR LEADER PROGRAM** is available for **9th graders** who are interested in learning and experiencing the skills needed to be future counselors.

Beginner and Intermediate **YOUTH TENNIS LESSONS** will be offered for youth 6-15 years old. Lessons will include skill development and games. All lessons will be held at the Iroquois High School tennis courts. Tri-Town Recreation will be offering **bus transportation to Marilla Primary at 8:30am**, after the 7:30am tennis lesson.

Tri-Town Recreation will **NOT** be offering any **SWIM PROGRAMS** this summer. The pool at the Iroquois Middle School will be closed while Capital Projects take place at the main campus.
